



COVID is still impacting many aspects of life in Uganda, and schools and churches remain closed. This has affected the children who attend Kitazigurukwa Special Needs Unit, but the staff continues to follow them up at home. Large clinics have been unable to resume due to restrictions on the number of people who are able to gather, however Evas has continued to run small OT/life skills sessions with limited numbers. She has also run a small feeding programme for some malnourished children in the project. Jones continues to run his club foot clinics. The chilli staff have worked hard this year, under difficult conditions, to encourage farmers and support their chilli growing, as well as enroll new families onto the chilli growing programme.

We are hopeful for a great chilli harvest this year, however this will be dependent upon the rules at the time. During the full lockdown during much of 2021, children and caregivers were unable to travel to CORSU and other hospitals for sur-

gery/review, however we did our best to refer them to local hospitals for basic services as much as possible. In June, the Bishop of North Kigezi, Benon Magezi, passed away from COVID. We are so saddened by the loss, but thankful for Bishop Patrick Tugume for coming out of retirement to 'hold the fort' as we wait for a new bishop to be appointed. Please keep this critical appointment in your prayers. One of the highlights of the year was in February, when CORSU selected the Chilli Children Project as one of the beneficiaries of brand new, donated, specially equipped wheelchairs. All in all, we are so thankful that we have been able to continue serving the communities of SW Uganda in various ways, despite the limiting and challenging circumstances this year. As with many charities, funds have dropped during the past couple of years. We still need a few people to commit to our Give 2021 campaign. Can this be you?!

We are so thankful to CORSU who, in February, invited the Project and 14 of its children to receive brand new, adaptable wheelchairs. These wheelchairs were commissioned by Bishop Benon Magezi the following week. They are such a gift to the children. Some children came with pressure sores as they had laid in one position day in, day out.

Many children who received wheelchairs have become too heavy for their parents to carry, and so are left at home. Since receiving the wheelchairs, children have been able to move out of home, sit and interact with the world around them. Many of the wheelchairs have tables, enabling the children to develop skills such as self-feeding, food preparation etc. THANK YOU CORSU!!



Chilli Update

Zaire, Martin and Victory have been busy 'in the field'. Their work includes preparing chilli nursery beds, distributing seedlings to farmers, monitoring chilli growing within families, teaching and training new chilli farmers, and preparing for the upcoming harvest in October.

Chilli growing is core to us as a Project. Chilli growing helps families to develop economically, providing them with much needed income which may be used for paying school fees, buying household necessities, paying for transport for medical treatment etc.

Since an answer to prayer in the increase of the buying price of chilli, many new rural farmers have enrolled onto the programme. We are so encouraged, and hopeful that chilli growing can continue to benefit families and communities alike.
