We pray that it will be used to serve the Project for many years to come, transporting hundreds of children for much needed operations, consultations and treatment.

The Chilli Children Project team were happy that the Bishop of North Kigezi Diocese, Bishop Patrick, was able to give thanks for the safe arrival of the ambulance and dedicate it to the work of the Project.

This happens each year and involves running or walking 4 miles on each of the 28 days of February; a total of 112 miles! 


Farewell and Welcome!

We would love this new Centre to be a place of light, of hope, of solace and of joy for families who are often shunned by their communities and families.

In 2016, we have so far had two surgical camps at Kisiizi Hospital - one orthopaedic (February) and one cleft lip/palate (May). We are so grateful to the surgeons from Cambridgeshire, UK, who worked at the orthopaedic camp, and the plastic surgeon from Mulago Hospital in Kampala who worked at our cleft lip/palate camp. The Trust believe totally that prayer must be at the heart of all we do and that without prayer we can achieve nothing. Please join us and pray for:

Continuing funding for the Project — we more we raise the more we can send. The needs remains ever great. Over 95% of money raised goes to the project.

FOR EXAMPLE—Surgery/treatment for hydrocephalus and spina bifida has increased from 750,000 shillings per child to 940,000 shillings (an extra £40-50) at Mbale Hospital. This is just one example of the need for prayer for increased giving to the Project, so that it can continue to do the work to change lives.

New staff, secretary Caroline and teacher Witness, as they work and serve the Chilli Children Project.

The new children enrolled at Kitazigurukwa Special Needs Unit this term. Pray that that will settle well, make good friends and thoroughly enjoy being at school.

The work, travel and service that the new ambulance will enable. Pray that the ambulance will transport many hundreds of families safely to camps, operations and hospitals.
