This week has been maths week, with the theme of 'Wild Maths'.

Reception children have had a blast this week, exploring maths outdoors and in nature. We counted legs on animals and even added them up, we spotted patterns in the garden before creating some of our own, we had an outdoor counting exercise challenge, we carefully looked at symmetry and animal markings and we aimed carefully during our beanbag target points game.

Year 1 had lots of fun being wild for Maths week. We made Math links to PE, art and geography. We even had a challenge of creating a face solely out of numbers. Rob the nest was a fan favourite!

Year 2 have gone wild for maths week in lots of different ways! We have been playing maths games/ puzzles and exploring what strategies can help us to win more often. We went outside for a science lesson and did some data handling with the elements we saw outdoors. We made some predictions in our yoga lesson and then tested how long we could hold our poses. We even took a full afternoon to explore fractal patterns in nature and art!

Year 3 have loved looking at how maths fits into the different subjects we have at school: science, art, PE and geography, we even accidentally did maths during PSHCE. Our favourite activity was probably measuring the school so we want to say thank you to the classes that let us measure their rooms!

Year 4 have enjoyed discovering how maths connects to lots of different areas of the curriculum in creative and practical ways. They investigated patterns inspired by nature and measured time while holding different yoga poses.

Year 5 have enjoyed their wild maths week through preparing, collecting and presenting data from our geography fieldwork! Through maps, we planned, plotted and measured our route. We then collected our numerical data before producing graphs and charts using laptops, before finally analysing what our data shows and coming to conclusions.

Year 6 went onto the roof playground to play maths strategy games: tapatan from the Philippines; len choa from Thailand; and nine men's morris, dating back to Roman times. We used Scratch to simulate fractals in nature, and played nature sudoku using found items from the school garden. We ended the week with a fantastic assembly from Starling class about their 'Kings and Queens' topic, as well as raising moey for the NSPCC by dressing up as numbers for 'Digits day'.
