Nursery have been doing a range of sensory science experiments! They found strange combinations of powders and liquids that created very exciting effects.

UKS2 have had a fun-filled science week! We had a firework workshop - looking at what chemicals make fireworks change colours. We made our own cars powered by balloons, saw the chemical reaction made when food colouring, milk and washing up liquid are mixed together and used 2-litre bottles to make our own bottle rockets - some flew higher than the school!
