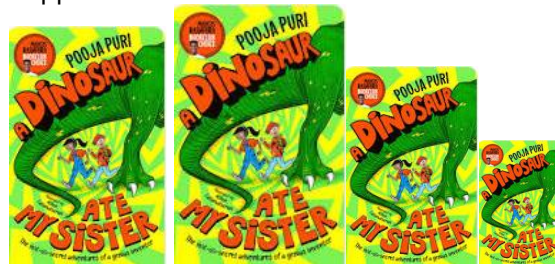

I'm here to make the world a better place

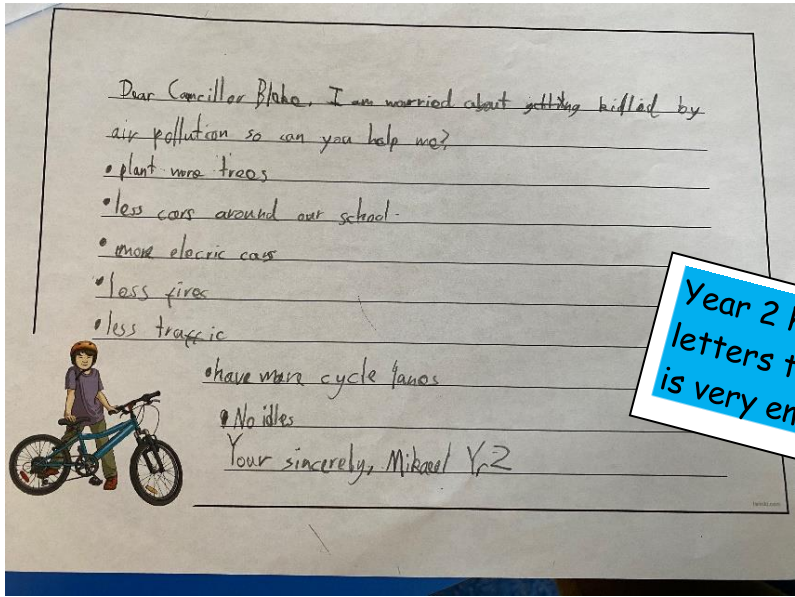
