I am delighted to share some wonderful experiences and updates from our school this week. Our younger pupils have been particularly engaged in exciting learning activities that connect them directly with nature and practical skills.

Year 1 began their first gardening session of the academic year with our dedicated gardener, Cassie. During this session, they explored and learned about the different parts of a plant, providing a hands-on approach to understanding botanical science. Our Nursery pupils were equally busy, spending time harvesting vegetables and enjoying the delightful experience of tasting fresh peas straight from the garden.

Year 4 participated in an impressive food workshop that offered practical culinary skills. The youth kitchen team guided our pupils through an engaging cooking experience where they learned essential kitchen techniques such as peeling, chopping, and even spiralizing vegetables to create their own ramen dishes. Pupil reflections captured the excitement of the day. Wyatt shared, "It was exciting because I have never made anything before, and the youth kitchen people were so helpful." Lily added, "It was fun because I enjoyed chopping the vegetables and we took the rest home to finish. It was yummy."

I would also like to address an important personnel update. Our school counsellor, Roxy, will be leaving us at half term to relocate to Exeter. While we are sad to see her go, we deeply appreciate the significant impact she has had on the lives of many Chisenhale pupils. Roxy has personally informed the children about her departure and will remain available to meet with pupils and parents until half term. The Schools Counselling Partnership has already identified an experienced practitioner who will replace Roxy, and we will ensure a thorough handover process. Martina will continue working at Chisenhale, providing continuity of support for our school community.
