It was lovely to see so many parents and carers in school today for our 'meet the teacher' event (and reception parents last week!) - we hope you enjoyed yourselves too! This term we have been focusing on developing our music provision in school. Y2 are doing really well in their weekly djembe drumming lessons. Y1 and Y3 are having weekly singing sessions with our new singing teacher, Meg (who also runs the after school choir). Meg will work with different year groups each term so everyone will get a turn. We also have lots more planned for the year ahead, including 'The Big Sing' for Y4 and Y5, which will culminate in a performance at the Bishopsgate Institute.

The author of 'In Our Hands' which was the focus whole school book when we came back to school in September will be delivering a <u>free workshop</u> at Tate Britain on Saturday 7th October, 2-3.30pm. We are having a lot more traffic around school in the mornings and afternoons. Please could parents walk, cycle or scoot with their children to school if at all possible? We want to try to protect children from dangerous traffic fumes as much as we can. Please also try not to stop in the road directly outside school to drop off your children as this is dangerous for the children getting out of the cars as well as those trying to cross the road.
