It was fantastic to see our pupils displaying such enthusiasm, determination, and sporting spirit across all the events. The energy and participation from every year group demonstrated the importance we place on physical activity and healthy competition. Thank you to all the staff who worked tirelessly to ensure these events ran smoothly, and to our families for their continued support and encouragement.

Alongside our sporting achievements, we have celebrated creativity through an amazing art week centred on the theme of birds. Our pupils engaged brilliantly with this project, exploring different artistic techniques and developing their understanding of how artists use nature as inspiration. The work produced has been truly impressive.

Our pupils have also benefited from some wonderful educational experiences beyond the classroom. Year 2 visited the Ragged School Museum, where they gained valuable insights into Victorian history. Year 5 had a particularly special day, beginning with a taster session at Morpeth School before visiting the Brady Arts Centre for a schools edition of 'East to Elsewhere'. Marking ninety years since the Battle of Cable Street, the performance celebrates how our communities continue to stand up to hate through creativity and connection. It showcases the living history of our borough and the solidarity that has always defined Tower Hamlets—a community that has consistently shown kindness to migrants, refugees, and asylum seekers.

Year 6 also had an exciting opportunity, taking part in a triathlon organised by the Brownlee Foundation. This was a wonderful experience that challenged our oldest pupils and reinforced the values of perseverance and personal achievement.

Outside the classroom, our PTA organised a fantastic summer fair on Saturday, which was thoroughly enjoyed by families and raised valuable funds for the school - over £3,000 we think, although the final figure is yet to be confirmed.
