On Monday, Niamh from the Tower Hamlets Education and Wellbeing Service (THEWS), came to the school to do some staff training. The training was around the issue of supporting neurodiverse pupils in school. Niamh was impressed by the range of strategies already being used by staff and had some very useful additional ideas to offer. Niamh had already done some training sessions for parents last term around anxiety and behaviour management and was in school again on Tuesday delivering a workshop on anxiety for some of our pupils. On Thursday, Year 4 enjoyed an interactive music workshop led by two professional percussionists from the Wyatt Sinfonia. They taught the children how to make sounds with different parts of their bodies, which helped them to create their own body percussion piece.
