I would also just like to ask, if you are bringing a snack for your child at the end of the school day, that you do not give it to them until you have left the school grounds.

There are some items your child needs to bring to school **every day** and they should all be **CLEARLY NAMED** so that we can return them if they are mislaid:

- A water bottle
- A book bag or other bag for their reading book and other items
- A jacket or coat. The children go out to play if there is only a slight drizzle and also line up at the end of the day in the playground so they need a waterproof coat in case of bad weather.
- Children should wear their PE kit on the days when they have PE, except Year 6, who should bring their kit in with them on the relevant days.

We will be encouraging Active Travel next week – this means walking, scooting or cycling to school. There will be stickers! We want to discourage families travelling to school by car whenever possible unless you are travelling a considerable distance. This will help to reduce pollution around the school gates in the mornings and afternoons.
