
Half Term Holiday

This week in EYFS!

On Wednesday morning **Nursery** children went on their first trip, to Victoria Park as we have been learning about the season of **Autumn**. We have been learning some Autumn rhymes and have been creating Autumn tree pictures, leaf prints, bark rubbing and Andrew Goldsworthy inspired collages using the natural materials we found in the park – leaves, conkers, acorns and sticks.







Reception children have been reading 'From Head to Toe' by Eric Carle and talking about their individual skills and abilities. They have continued their phonics programme focusing on the letter/sounds p - i - n. Next week they will complete phonics phase 2, set 2. We are planning to hold a parent workshop in the school library prior to our half term holiday to explain how we teach phonics to help your child develop their early reading and writing skills.

Dates for this workshop will be confirmed shortly. It will be held at the beginning of the school day

Reception teachers have also completed the **Statutory Baseline Assessment** for the children in their classes.

At the **end of the day** we would ask that **Sun Class parents** and **Star Class parents** queue <u>against the wall.</u> **Moon Class parents** <u>against the green screen</u>.

Tracy (Sun), **Helen** (Moon) and **Harriet** (Star) will be at the gate on alternate evenings so you can get to know the Early Years Team.

Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day. Please check their book bag daily for important letters or information. Initially we will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every **Friday**.



How you can help

You can help by reading to and with your child every day.



Bikes & Scooters

We are able to accommodate bikes and scooters in the Early Years playground if your child chooses to scoot or cycle to school.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Play with water, mud, paint and sand are essential experiences for children in the Early Years which have important developmental learning outcomes. We encourage this exploration, **but it can get messy!**

Therefore, please ensure that your child has a **spare set of clothes** in their **changing bag** at school in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day.

Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
