
Half Term Holiday

The half-term holiday will be from Monday 23rd -Friday 27th October.

On Thursday morning Sun Nursery made their first trip of the year to Victoria Park to look at the environment and to experience **Autumn** through our senses. Thanks to all the parents who shared this important milestone with us. We hope you are proud of how far we have come already!

This week in Sun Nursery we have painted Autumn leaves and trees and learned some Autumn rhymes. We read 'Leaf Man' by Lois Ehlert and then made our own picture using found materials from our walk in the park. This week we have begun the 'Think Equal' programme by considering the similarities and differences between ourselves and others. Our word of the week is Autumn.





Kingfisher Class have also been researching facts about Kingfishers and making drawings and collages of Kingfishers.

Book Bags & Reading

Reception children now have a daily phonics lesson. This supports them to read simple books independently after the first few weeks of the programme. Every child in Reception will have a 'Bug Club' login to access texts at the appropriate level online. The designated books include only the letters, sounds and 'tricky words' which the children have encountered in the programme and therefore should be ready to read themselves.
