Learning Together for a Better Future

This week in EYFS!

In Nursery we have been learning about Harvest and Harvest Festival Celebrations. We learnt a 300 year old song and ring game called "Oats & Beans & Barley Grow", and read the story of The Little Red Hen before, like the Little Red Hen, making bread and eating it!



Reception children went on their first trip to Victoria Park. Star class went on Wednesday morning and Moon Class on Thursday afternoon as they have been learning about the season of **Autumn**. They have continued their phonics programme focusing on the letter/sounds **d & m**. This week they have completed Tower Hamlets phonics programme phase 2, set 2.



We will be holding a **parent workshop** in the school **library** on **Monday** morning, **18th October**. It will be held at the beginning of the school day from **9-10am** to explain how we teach phonics to help your child develop their early reading and writing skills.

At the end of the day we continue to request that Sun Class parents and Star Class parents queue <u>against the wall</u>, Moon Class parents <u>against the</u> <u>green screen</u>.

Tracy (Sun), Helen (Moon) and Harriet (Star) will be at the gate on alternate evenings so you can get to know the Early Years Team.

Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day. Please check their book bag daily for important letters or information. Initially we will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every **Friday**.

How can I prepare my child to read?

Bikes & Scooters

We are able to accommodate bikes and scooters in the Early Years playground if your child chooses to scoot or cycle to school.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Play with water, mud, paint and sand are essential experiences for children in the Early Years which have important developmental learning outcomes. We encourage this exploration, **but it can get messy!**

Therefore, please ensure that your child has a **spare set of clothes** in their **changing bag** at school in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day. Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
