Drop off and pick up for Nursery and Reception is via the garden gate in Vivian Road. We would appreciate if parents would queue towards the school main entrance and leave in the direction of Roman Road to ensure a safe, calm and orderly entrance and exit for your children.

Initially we will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every **Friday**. As the term progresses we will also send home a book which is matched to their reading ability.
