Half Term Holiday

The half-term holiday will be from Monday 28th October -Friday 1st November.







On Thursday morning Sun Nursery made their first trip of the year to Victoria Park to look at the environment and to experience **Autumn** through our senses. Thanks to all the parents who shared this important milestone with us. We hope you are proud of how far we have come already!

In Sun Class our word of the week has been 'Autumn'. We thought about how our five senses can be used to explore our environment. We read poems about our senses. We painted Autumn leaves and we learned some action rhymes about Autumn. We read 'Leaf Man' by Lois Ehlert and then made our own picture using found materials from our walk in the park. This week we have begun the 'Think Equal' programme by considering the similarities and

differences between ourselves and others, including all the different shades of brown of our skin colours. In mathematics we have been counting collections of objects associated with Autumn such as leaves and conkers and learning to



This week Reception classes have been introduced to the book '**Stanley's Stick' by John Hegley**. Their word of the week is '**imagine'** and they have been *imagining* what they could use a stick for. They also wrote a set of rules for using sticks safely and have drawn and labelled their own sticks. In the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme the children have continued learning the letter-sound correspondence for letters of the alphabet in turn. This includes reading and writing. This week they have focused on the letters **g & o.** They will be securing the lower case form of each letter so you may see your child practising the formation at home. In mathematics they have been **comparing** objects and **ordering** them by their size.
