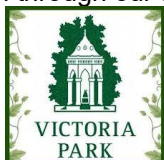

In the next few weeks we plan to make our first trip to Victoria Park to look at the environment and to experience Autumn through our senses.



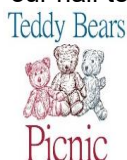
In October we will be introducing Black History Month through story.

The half-term holiday will be from **Monday 25th-Friday 29th October.**

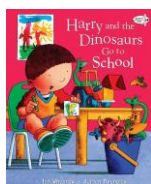
School will also be closed on **Friday 22nd October** for an INSET day.

This week in EYFS!

We are continuing to admit new children into Sun Nursery and once children are settled they will also separate from their parents at our garden gate in **Vivian Road**. This gate will be open from **8.45am** in the morning and will close at **9am**. The school day ends at **3.05pm** for Nursery children and **3.15pm** for Reception children. At the beginning and end of the school day we would appreciate if parents would queue towards the school main entrance. At the end of the day we would ask that **Sun Class parents** and **Star Class parents** queue against the wall, **Moon Class parents** against the green screen, and leave in the direction of Roman Road to ensure a safe entrance and exit for your children. **Tracy** (Sun), **Helen** (Moon) and **Harriet** (Star) will be at the gate on alternate afternoons so you can get to know us.



Our topic in **Reception** is 'Me, Myself & I' whilst in **Nursery** it's 'All About Me!'. This week Reception have read 'Happy Birthday Maisy' and have been talking about and planning a birthday celebration on Friday. The Nursery children have been getting to know each other through playing ring and circle games, including 'The Farmer's in his den', where they have been demonstrating their ability to take turns, sing and dance. They have also been reading stories about starting school and exploring their new environment.



Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day. Please check their book bag daily for important letters or information. Initially we will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every **Friday**.

How can I prepare my child to read?

Bikes & Scooters

We are able to accommodate bikes and scooters in the Early Years playground if your child chooses to scoot or cycle to school.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Play with water, mud, paint and sand are essential experiences for children in the Early Years which have important developmental learning outcomes. We encourage this exploration, **but it can get messy!**

Therefore, please ensure that your child has a **spare set of clothes** in their **changing bag** at school in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day. Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
