This Week in the EYFS

Our word of the week in Sun Nursery has been Harvest ahead of our whole school celebration of Harvest Festival on Friday. We enjoyed reading and role playing 'The Little Red Hen'. We made a story map and some character puppets and got very good at the dialogue! We also followed a recipe to make bread rolls – and then we ate them! We learned the rhymes 'Oats, Peas, Beans and Barley Grow' and 'Dingle Dangle Scarecrow'. In mathematics we enjoyed exploring and identifying 2d shapes. This week we have continued the 'Think Equal' programme by thinking about how unique and special each member of Sun Class is!









Reception classes have begun their **Black History Month** study by looking at the life and art of the British Nigerian artist **Yinka Shonibare** and have been creating their own portraits and sculptures inspired by his work. In the Tower Hamlets phonics programme the children have learned the digraph **ck**, **e & u** and are continuing to practice reading the Tricky Words **I**, **the**, **is**, **to**, **no**, **go & of**. In mathematics they have been focusing on the numbers **1**, **2 & 3**. They have been finding and matching and subitising quantities in this range and practising reading and writing the numerals. They have also been learning a song about kindness, which they hope to share with you next Friday. On Friday Reception Classes also enjoyed a drama session led by the Drama4All organisation themed on 'Knights, Dragons and Princesses'. They are part of the Perform organisation who offer drama, dance and singing classes for 4-12 year old children at Victoria Park Baptist Church.

White Rose Maths Reception Jigsaw trial

We are delighted to confirm that Chisenhale Primary School has been selected to take part in the White Rose Maths Reception Jigsaw trial. This means that this year our staff will be receiving training and resources which will develop the mathematics provision and teaching and learning for children in the EYFS.

The programme is underpinned by strong principles of early years mathematics teaching, specifically: learning through play; opportunities to explore and investigate through classroom provision; starting from and building on children's interests; using real objects in meaningful contexts to introduce mathematics learning; and the role of the adult in supporting and enhancing learning through a balance of adult-led and child-initiated activities. It is designed to improve whole class teaching practice within regular class time.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property
