

This week we have welcomed five new children who have part-time places to Sun Nursery and your children have been getting to know each other by playing ring and circle games. They have been demonstrating their ability to join in, take turns, sing and dance, including learning a 'Dinosaur Movement Song'. Our Word of the week is 'Dinosaur'. We read the stories 'Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs' and 'Harry and the Dinosaurs go to school'. We have been learning the names of Harry's dinosaurs, and have printed our own 'bucketful of dinosaurs'. We have also been reading stories and information about dinosaurs. In Mathematics we have been sorting, counting and ordering dinosaurs.



This week Reception classes have been reading 'Ruby's Worry' by Tom Percival. They have also begun the 'Think Equal' programme for PHSE by thinking about similarities and differences which they also linked to their work in Mathematics. They have started the Phonics programme which is recommended by Tower Hamlets. This is how reading and writing is taught at Chisenhale School. The children will begin by learning the letter-sound correspondence for each of the letters of the alphabet in turn. This will include reading and writing the letters in turn. This week they have focused on the letters s, a & t. They will be focusing on the lower case form of each letter. Please help your child to practise writing their names using an initial capital followed by lower case letters.

Arrivals

In the morning we open the Vivian Road gate from 8.45am to 9am. Now that all the children are aware of the routines and expectations on arrival please could parents say goodbye to children at the gate or, if necessary, just inside the EYFS playground, and not in the classroom.

Our teaching day begins at 9am and it can be difficult for teachers to start the teaching and learning with parents still in the room as it impacts on the other children in the cohort, who are being encouraged to develop positive attitudes for learning such as independence, resilience and self-regulation. If your child attends Breakfast Club they need to arrive by 8.15am in order to be served food in the EYFS Breakfast Club.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Play with water, mud, paint and sand are essential experiences for children in the Early Years which have important developmental learning outcomes. We encourage this exploration, but it can get messy!

Therefore, please ensure that your child has a spare set of clothes in their changing bag at school in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle into school every day. Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property. Friday is non-uniform day at Chisenhale Primary School
