Learning Together for a Better Future

During this term our topic in Reception will be 'Me, Myself & I' whilst in Nursery it's 'All About Me!'. You should have received information about the 'All About Me' booklets (Nursery) or 'Me, Myself & I' (Reception) boxes. Please bring them into school when they are completed. This activity is a good way of us learning more about your unique child.







This week Reception have read 'From Head to Toe' by Eric Carle. They have been thinking about what they can do and composing simple sentences to match photographs of their activities. They have continued their phonics learning programme with the letters and sounds for m & d. In Mathematics we have continued consolidating children's knowledge of the numbers 1-5. They have also been thinking about how we develop a growth mindset for learning.

The Nursery children have continued getting to know each other through playing ring and circle games, and learning songs and rhymes including 'There was a Princess Long Ago'. They have been developing their ability to join in, take turns, sing and dance. .

Tracy (Sun), Faiza (Moon) and April (Star) will be at the gate on alternate evenings so you can begin to get to know your child's teacher. It is difficult to have a conversation at the gate whilst we are supervising the safe entry and exit of children so please use the designated email addresses (see below left) to message us and we will respond.

Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day. Please check their book bag daily for important letters or information. Initially we will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every Friday.

Bikes & Scooters

We are able to accommodate bikes and scooters in the Early Years playground if your child chooses to scoot or cycle to school.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Play with water, mud, paint and sand are essential experiences for children in the Early Years which have important developmental learning outcomes. We encourage this exploration, but it can get messy!

Therefore, please ensure that your child has a spare set of clothes in their changing bag at school in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle into school every day. Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
