This Week in the EYFS

We marked our return to school after the half-term holiday with some spooky celebrations! On Tuesday we had **Halloween** fun, we enjoyed dressing up in costumes and learning about this folk festival.

In Nursery we hollowed out pumpkins which came from from Kit's grandad's pumpkin patch! We made our own pumpkin faces and we learned some pumpkin rhymes. Our literacy work focused on the story 'Room on the Broom'. Our Word of the week was celebrations as we thought about what we do to celebrate different occasions.

There were witches everywhere as Reception children were reading 'Meg & Mog' and have been mixing ingredients before writing spooky spells and potions. Their word of the week was spell.







Reception resumed their phonics programme and this week they have been focusing on the letter/sounds h and b. In mathematics they have been learning about the composition of three and understanding what it means to find 1 more and 1 less than a given number. In the Think Equal PHSE programme they have been thinking about what it means to be kind and kindness.

Friday was all about **Fireworks Night** as we 'Remember, Remember the 5th of November – Gunpowder, Treason & Plot!" with Fireworks in the EYFS garden this morning. We hope many of you will join us for the Chisenhale Fireworks Display this evening so we will be going out with a bang this week!







Book Bags & Reading

Reception children now have a daily phonics lesson. This supports them to read simple books independently after the first few weeks of the programme. Every child in Reception will have a 'Bug Club' login to access texts at the appropriate level online. The designated books include only the letters, sounds and 'tricky words' which the children have encountered in the programme and therefore should be ready to read themselves.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Please ensure that your child has their changing bag at school every day in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

We would welcome donations of carrier bags, and any outgrown wellington boots, shoes, leggings or jogging bottoms.

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day.

Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!
