The Autumn term will conclude on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> December at 2pm.


School will reopen on Wednesday 8th January 2025.

#### This Week in the EYFS

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas in the EYFS. We have begun our Christmas preparations, and our classrooms are beginning to look very festive with Christmas trees and decorations appearing all over the setting. We have also begun practising the Christmas songs and rhymes which we hope you will enjoy hearing when you join us on the afternoon of **Thursday 19th December** (see below for details).

This week **Nursery** have been opening their **Advent Calendar** and thinking about Christmas preparations. We learned that **pantomime** is a **tradition**, as we heard the traditional story of '**Aladdin**' ahead of the visit from the Stage Ed Theatre Company on Thursday. We role played making our own **Magic Carpet** ride and thought about where we would choose to go on our adventures. After hearing the story we made a character portrait and story map. On Friday we learnt about **Saint Nicholas** and discovered that he had left a gold coin in our shoes!







Reception have been reading 'Blue Penguin' by Petr Horacek. They have begun learning about the Arctic and the Antarctic, and the similarities and differences between them, including the creatures that live there. Their word of the week has been wander. In the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme the children have been learning the letter-sound correspondence for Ss. They have also been learning the correct formation of those letters and learning to read to six new tricky words: put, as, has, into, I and her. In mathematics they have been investigating four sided shapes, and also recognising and describing their daily routines.



Next **Thursday 12**<sup>th</sup> **December** in the morning EYFS children will be going to St Barnabas Church to watch the dress rehearsal of this year's Key Stage 1 Nativity Production.
