This Week in the EYFS

This week was Maths Week at Chisenhale school. Early Years children explored how '3 is a Magic Number!







In Sun Nursery our word of the week was number. We enjoyed reciting nursery rhymes that feature three including 'Baa Baa Blacksheep', 'Three Blind Mice' and 'Three Little Kittens'. We found sets and groups of three items and explored mixing the three primary colours (red, yellow & blue) to make the secondary colours (orange, green & purple). We have also joined in with Teddy Bear songs and rhymes and learned about the history of the Teddy Bear. In the Think Equal PHSE programme we learned the 'Colour Poem' and began thinking about how our feelings and emotions can change.

Our **Reception** classes both enjoyed a whole day led by the **Artburst** team. They learned some songs and rhymes, created masks and puppets, painted a backdrop and then performed to an audience of Sun Nursery children. Despite this excitement, **Maths Week** and preparation for the **Teddy Bears Picnic**, they have been continuing their phonics programme and this week they have been focusing on the double consonants **ss**, **f f** and **II**.





On Friday we all brought our teddy or snuggly to school to join our **Teddy Bears' Picnic**. We made honey or marmalade sandwiches and ate honey biscuits and Pom Bear crisps in our classrooms. Reception children mixed their own mocktails to drink. We wore something spotty and raised money for **Children in Need.**

Book Bags & Changing Bags

Our newly designed Book Bags & Changing Bags have arrived and are now available to purchase from the school office.

Sun Nursery children have been given their first book bag and changing bag for free. They will now be bringing home a book every Friday. If children have a changing bag in school we will transfer the contents over to the new bag. Otherwise we would ask that you provide a change of clothes in the new bag as soon as you receive it.

Book bags should be brought to school every day.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Please ensure that your child has their changing bag at school every day in case they get wet or dirty. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag for you to return the next day.

We would welcome donations of carrier bags, and any outgrown wellington boots, shoes, leggings or jogging bottoms.

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day.

Please make sure it is named.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
