This Week in the EYFS!


This week Nursery children have been looking at a range of alphabetic texts to consolidate their knowledge of the alphabet. We have sung the alphabet song and done alphabet yoga! We have looked at the initial letter of our names and learned that this is always represented by an upper case or capital letter. We used potatoes to print the initial capital letter of our name. We have read many alphabetic texts including 'Zoe and her Zebra' by Stella Blackstone & Claire Beaton after which we made our own page for a class book of our names.







Nursery have a weekly focus letter/sound in phonics and this week it has been Pp for potato, princess and penguin. We are thinking about things that begin with that letter/sound and are clapping the syllables in each word to develop our phonological awareness.




Reception have been hearing about the adventures of 'The Naughty Bus' They have painted buses with passengers and identified their destination! They have continued their phonics programme focusing on I and II. Please help your children to learn the following 'tricky' words to develop their sight vocabulary:

> to, the, is, I, into, her, has, put, as, no, go, of In mathematics they have begun to explore the numbers between 5 and 10.

Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day. Please check their book bag daily for important letters or information. Initially we will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home

Bikes & Scooters

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property
