Half-term


School will close on Friday 9th February and reopen on Monday 19th February.

This week in the EYFS

In Nursery our Word of the Week has been tale as our topic this half term is Traditional Rhymes and Stories. Our key text was 'Once Upon A Time' by John Prater. We identified the characters in the text and listened to and recited the rhymes and traditional tales that they feature in. We compared this text with 'Each Peach Pear Plum' to find the similarities and differences between these two rhyming texts, where the illustrations add to the narrative. We chose our favourite then we put this information on a pictogram. We also wrote our own 'Once Upon A Fairytale'. We revisited Tt & Pp

in our 'Letters & Sounds' phonics work. In 'Think Equal' we have been thinking about how we use our voices.







This week Reception classes have been hearing the story of 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse'. Their word of the week was field. They have learned about the characteristics of mice (and the proper plural of mouse!). They have covered the vowel digraph oo, which can be read in words like wood and moon (it can represent two different sounds) in the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme. In mathematics, they have been exploring, comparing and measuring objects by their capacity.

On Thursday both Reception classes visited the exhibition of Alia Farid's fantastic hangings at Chisenhale Gallery. They then created their own images to make a classroom frieze, which they are looking forward to sharing with you next Friday.
