### This Week in the EYFS

It was another three day week in the EYFs, due to the heating and water issues throughout the school. Thank you for your patience and understanding while the issue was resolved. Despite this, we have welcomed three more new children and their families to Nursery this week. They have made a very positive start to their time in Sun Class.

In Nursery our word of the week has been **resolutions** as we have been completing our Sun Class and individual **New Year resolutions** and writing them on stars. We have also been playing games to learn the names of our nine new class members.



Our Reception classes have been continuing their exploration of **traditional tales** for their topic. They have been identifying a range of stories from this genre and will be voting on which tale they would most like to study in more depth.

In phonics, the children have been learning the letter-sound correspondence for **Qu**. They have also been reading and writing the 'tricky words': **he, she, be, by** and **my**. In mathematics, they have been enjoying songs which include counting back from 5-0. **Reception parents are most welcome at the phonics workshop on Friday 31**<sup>st</sup> **January, 9am in the library,** to find out more about how we teach phonics and how you can support your child's learning.
