Learning Together for a Better Future

This Week in the EYFS.

This week we welcomed Yunus who joined Sun Class.

In Nursery this half term our topic is Traditional Rhymes and Tales. This week we continued our work on 'Each Peach Pear Plum'. We baked plum pie and, after a tasting session, said whether we liked or disliked it. We also identified our favourite character and explained why we liked them best. We held 'Nursery Rhyme X Factor' where we each performed a Nursery Rhyme for our audience of Sun Class children. We also enjoyed hearing the traditional tale of Robin Hood.







Reception Classes have continued learning about the Antarctic. They have been thinking about the story 'Blue Penguin' and exploring its themes of difference and diversity. They have been celebrating their individuality in their writing. They are continuing to develop their knowledge of letters and sounds in phonics (letter X this week) and are using and applying what they have learnt in 1:1 reading with their teachers, and through shared and guided writing groups as well as in selfinitiated opportunities in the setting. In mathematics, Reception have been learning strategies for counting on. They have also been comparing and measuring height.

Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school **every day**. Please check their book bag for important letters or information. We will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every **Friday**.

Children in Reception are also issued with a **Bug Club login**. This is an **online reading resource** where class teachers allocate texts. Parents should log on **weekly** for children to practise reading an appropriate level of text using their developing phonic knowledge. When children are given this opportunity to read to and with parents at home it makes a real difference to their fluency and has a positive impact on their progress and attainment in reading.

<u>Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property</u> We sent all changing bags home at the end of last term

Please ensure that your child returns to school a **spare set of clothes** (underwear, a top, leggings or jogging bottoms) in their changing bag in case they get wet or dirty. This should include spare **socks** and **shoes**.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day. Please make sure it is named.

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
