## This Week in the EYFS

In Nursery, our word of the week has been **syllable.** We have been practising identifying and clapping the syllables in animal names. This is one of the skills children need to master to develop their phonological awareness. We read the book 'Monkey & Me' by Emily Gravett and learned to clap the syllables in the names of all the animals in the book and many, many more! We explored the difference in the number of syllables (e.g bat & kangaroo). In phonics we also focused on the letter/sound Hh. For mathematics we learned to recite the rhymes 'Tommy Thumb' and 'One finger, one thumb, keep moving'. We also made our own Tommy Thumb puppets. Our **Think Equal** work focused on the importance of listening.









Our Reception classes have been continuing their exploration of traditional tales. Wrens voted to focus on the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' whilst Woodlarks chose 'The Gingerbread Man'. They then wrote their own versions of the story. In phonics, the children have been learning the letter-sound correspondence for the consonant digraph Ch. They have also been introduced to two more 'tricky words': they and push. In mathematics they have been learning to compare and measure weight and capacity. They have also begun to participate in drama sessions delivered by Artis. Their word of the week this week has been 'Festival' as they have started learning about the Lunar New Year, in preparation for our celebrations at the end of next week.
