This week in the EYFS

In Nursery our Word of the Week has been **rhyme** as our topic this half term is **Traditional Rhymes and Stories**. Our key text is **'Each Peach Pear Plum'**. We identified the characters in the text and listened to and recited the rhymes and stories that they feature in. We chose our favourite characters from the text and explained why we liked them. We then put this information on a **pictogram**. We have enjoyed playing the game **'I spy'** and linked this to our phonic knowledge as we revisited **Aa** in our **'Letters & Sounds'** phonics work. In **'Think Equal'** we have been thinking about the many things that make us special and unique. We decorated a ladybird to reflect our different personalities.







This week Reception classes extended their learning about **penguins**. They wrote a letter to '**Blue Penguin**'. Their word of the week was **dream** and they drew and described their own dreams, after hearing about Blue Penguin's dream. They made penguin posters to record all the information they have acquired about this fascinating creature. They also made some lovely penguin artwork. They have covered the vowel digraph **oa** and trigraph **igh** in the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme. In mathematics they have been exploring, comparing and measuring objects by their mass.
