This Week in the EYFS

This week in Nursery our word of the week has been **order** as we enjoyed learning about the story of 'The Great Race'. This is a **traditional story** from China. which explains the order of the years of the Chinese Zodiac, which are named after animals. We have discovered which animal year we were born into – Nursery children were either born in the year of the dog, or the year of the pig. We also learned that this is the year of the rabbit. We have been making dragon kites and lanterns. Our mathematical learning has been focused on ordinal number as we described the order that animals finished in the race – from first to twelfth. In our Think Equal curriculum we have been thinking about in which ways we are the same or different and we made a rainbow of our favourite colours!







Reception classes' Word of the Week has been **festival** as they have also learned about the **Lunar New Year**. They have also heard the story of **'The Great Race'** before exploring the Chinese number system and making decorations for the classroom ready for our Lunar New Year Celebrations. In phonics, they have continued Phase 3 of the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme and have been learning the digraphs **zz** and **qu**. In Mathematics they have been ordering numbers and practising counting backwards.
