#### This week in the EYFS

In Nursery Our 'Word of the Week' has been 'word'. We began by 'reading' a wordless version of the traditional tale 'The Ugly Duckling' before writing our own version. We also reflected on how hurtful unkind words can be, and thought of something to say to comfort the 'duckling'. We listened and practised singing the song. We prepared for World Book Day by reading 'Open Very Carefully – A Book with Bite' then we each created a costume for the crocodile. We have added Gg to the letters that we can name and sound in our phonic knowledge.





Reception have followed up their visit to Victoria Park by writing a recount of their trip using time connectives. In phonics, they have continued Phase 3 of the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme and have been learning the vowel trigraph ure (in pure). They have been preparing for World Book Day by composing a World Book Day Rap which they performed for an audience of their peers, and recorded. In mathematics the children have been exploring number bonds for 10.

On Friday, we celebrated **Word Book Day** in the EYFS by dressing up as our favourite book character and talking about our favourite books. We also held a costume parade through the garden, and did a book swap and character hunt in the garden.
