This Week in the EYFS








This week all the classes in the EYFS went on visits to

Spitalfields City Farm where we enjoyed a tour of the farm to
meet the animal residents. Many thanks to the parent volunteers
who accompanied us. In our classrooms we have been
developing our knowledge and understanding of the world and
specifically about farms and farming ahead of our trip. We have
been extending our vocabulary as we learn the names of the
male and female and young of different farm animals. The
'Living Eggs' that were delivered on Monday morning had
begun to hatch by Wednesday morning and this has been an
exciting process for our children to observe, and to explore and
express their ideas about life cycles, growth and change.







In Nursery we continued our phonics learning, and have now added **c** and **k** to the letters and sounds that we know. In mathematics we counted and drew the 10 eggs in the **incubator**.

Book Bags & Reading

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school **every day**. Please check their book bag for important letters or information. We will be inviting your child to choose a book to take home and share with you every **Friday**.

Children in Reception are also issued with a **Bug Club login**. This is an **online reading resource** where class teachers allocate texts. Parents should log on **weekly** for children to practise reading an appropriate level of text using their developing phonic knowledge. When children are given this opportunity to read to and with parents at home it makes a real difference to their fluency and has a positive impact on their progress and attainment in reading.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Please ensure your child's changing bag is replenished and returned to school promptly. Your child needs a **spare set of clothes** (underwear, a top, leggings or jogging bottoms) in their changing bag in case they get wet or dirty. This should include spare **socks** and **shoes**.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

Children also need to continue to bring a **water bottle** into school every day.

Please make sure it is named.

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
