This week in the EYFS

In Nursery our 'Word of the Week' has been 'environment' as we prepared to become 'Environment Explorers' at the Soanes Centre on Wednesday and Thursday.

We learned how to identify some of the living things that we might encounter in the environment of Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park. On our trip we were able to see daffodils, bluebells, crocuses, and wild garlic as well discovering some of the tiny creatures that live in the pond as we did some pond dipping too! On Friday we wrote a recount of our trip. We have added **Cc** to the letters that we can name and sound in our phonic knowledge.

Reception have continued looking at the ways in which living things change over time. Their beans have begun sprouting and they have been making regular observations of the ducklings, who have grown and grown. On Thursday we watched them take their first swimming lesson in a pool. In phonics, they are coming to the end of Phase 3 of the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme and have been learning to read and write two syllable words such as ticket and padlock. In mathematics the children have been learning about 3d shapes. Thanks to all the Nursery parents who have already returned the Talking Time consent slips. It would be great to have the remainder returned on Monday morning.
