#### **End of Term Holiday**


The end of the Spring Term will be on **Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March** when school will close at **2pm**.

## This Week in the EYFS

Welcome Back - we are now half way through our school year! In **Nursery** we began the week thinking about our first **100 days of school** and what we have achieved so far – and how much progress we might make by July! We have been trying to write our names all by ourselves! Our 'Word of the Week' has been '**number**' as we have been thinking about the difference between letters and numbers. We have added **Mm** to the letters that we can name and sound in our phonic knowledge.







In Reception the children have enjoying the traditional story 'The Three Little Pigs'. They have been constructing buildings with straw and sticks and bricks and role playing the story, including using and making their own puppets. The Reception classes' Word of the Week has been 'villain' – I wonder who they were thinking of? They have been making 'Wanted' posters in an attempt to track down the villain from their story. In phonics, they have continued Phase 3 of the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme and have been learning the consonant blends nk and ng which are in words like rink and ring. In mathematics they have been learning to use the language of comparison to compare quantities and numbers to say which is more or fewer than a given number.

## **Book Bags & Reading**

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day.

Please help us maintain our stock of picture books by promptly returning any books which your child has been issued with during this year.

Reception Class teachers have provided your child with their individual **username** and **password** for our online reading resource **Bug Club**.



You will now be able to go online to access the books which each child has been allocated.

#### Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

As the weather is now more changeable, please ensure that your child wears appropriate clothes to school including a **weatherproof coat** and **footwear**.

It remains important that your child has a **spare set of clothes** in their changing bag at school in case they get wet or dirty. This should include spare **socks** and **shoes**. If your child needs to change we will send the dirty clothes home in a plastic bag in their changing bag.

Please ensure spare clothes are replenished and returned the next day.
