
The festival of Eid occurs next week. We will celebrate in school next **Friday 14**th **May**. On that day children are welcome to wear their party clothes!

End of Day Arrangements

The Green Screens enable our families to wait safely when dropping off and collecting the children.

Nursery parents should queue <u>against the wall</u> from 3.10pm for pick up at the end of the day, whilst Reception parents should queue <u>against the Green Screens</u> from 3.20pm.

All queuing from the gate towards the school office.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Children need changing bags in school. They can leave them in school, and we will only send them home if they have had to change during the day. Any wet or dirty clothes will be put in a recycled plastic bag in the changing bag.

We always need more carrier bags, if you have them.

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name, into school every day.

This should only contain fresh water.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!
