In Nursery we have been reading the story of 'Rosie's Walk'. We have made paintings of Rosie the hen, and finger puppets of the fox and the hen. Our phonic learning has been 'h' for hen and hive! We have also learnt the rhyme 'Here is the beehive' and visited the Chisenhale School beehive at the top of the school.





Reception children have been continuing their learning about plants and growing in their topic work. This week they have been learning to recite some rhymes about growth. They have also labelled their plant paintings. They have been developing their understanding of numbers greater than 10 using numicon, one of our maths resources.

End of day arrangements

The green screens enable our families to wait safely when dropping off and collecting the children.
