Kingfishers will be going on



# This week in the EYFS

This week in Nursery our word of the week has been 'Earth'. We began learning about our planet on Monday as it was 'Earth Day' (22<sup>nd</sup> April). We have been thinking about what we can do to protect our planet, including recycling and not wasting precious resources. We shared the information books 'I am Earth' and 'Here we Are" before writing our own notes on planet Earth. We made Earth sun catchers and learned the words and actions to 'we've got the whole world in our hands." We have added Uu to the letters that we can name and sound in our phonic knowledge.







Reception have been learning about plants and growing. Their word of the week is 'germinate'. They have planted cress seeds and have been thinking about what they need to grow into plants. In phonics they have begun Phase 4 of the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme and have been learning to read and write words ending in the adjacent final consonants nck, and nch. In mathematics the children have been practising identifying and making patterns.
