This week in the EYFS





In Nursery, we concluded our learning about travelling with the journey made by '10 Little Rubber Ducks' by Eric Carle. This is based on a true story of a consignment of toys that was lost at sea. The story includes directional and positional language and ordinal numbers to describe where each of the rubber ducks drifted to on the ocean. We counted, drew, labelled, collaged and painted ducks. Our phonic learning has been the letter 'j' for journey.







In Reception, the children read books about diversity and difference as they revisited Black History Month themes, which they would usually have covered in the Autumn Term. Their mathematical learning has been focused on doubling numbers.

End of day arrangements

The green screens enable our families to wait safely when dropping off and collecting the children.

Nursery parents should queue <u>against the wall</u> from 3.10pm for pick up at the end of the day, whilst Reception parents should queue <u>against the green screens</u> from 3.20pm.

Clothing, water bottles & lost property

Children need changing bags in school. They can leave them in school, and we will only send them home if they have had to change during the day. Any wet or dirty clothes will be put in a recycled plastic bag in the changing bag.
