This week in the EYFS

In Nursery we have been reading Michael Rosen's version of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We have learnt the words with actions and expressions! We made a collaged story map, cut out a bear to go in a cave, and drawn a bear. Our phonic learning has been 'b' for bear.





Reception children have been focusing on water in their topic work about growing. They have been learning about the water cycle and have been experimenting with the different scientific states that water can take. In Mathematics they have been exploring capacity through using water.

End of Day Arrangements

The green screens enable our families to wait safely when dropping off and collecting the children.

Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name, into school every day.
