This week in the EYFS

On **Wednesday** Dora from the Community Theatre Group **Drama4All** led us for an '**Under the Sea**' drama workshop.







In Nursery we read the book 'I Spy Under the Sea' which drew on our knowledge of the world, phonics and numbers. We also focused on the word I in speech bubbles that read 'I am a'. We learnt about the Octopus, and enjoyed singing 'There's a hole in the bottom of the sea' and 'Let's go under the sea'. In mathematics we have been subitising numbers up to 8 (Octopus do have 8 legs!).

Our phonic learning has been the letter 'Qq' for queen.





Reception classes introduced a seaside theme with 'Splash,
Anna Hibiscus'. Their mathematical learning has been focused
on learning about money and coins in currency in the
United Kingdom.

Summer!

When the weather is now very warm and sunny you may want to think about applying sunscreen to your child **before** they come to school in the morning, and sending them in with a hat or cap (please add a name label as they are easily mislaid). We advise against children wearing open-toed sandals due to the risk of injury to their toes.

Clothing, water bottles & lost property

Children need changing bags in school. They can leave them in school, and we will only send them home if they have had to change during the day. Any wet or dirty clothes will be put in a recycled plastic bag in the changing bag.

We always need more carrier bags, if you have them.

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name, into school every day.

This should only contain fresh water.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
