This week in the EYFS

On **Thursday** morning we held our **EYFS sports day**. We had an obstacle course in the EYFS playground, long jump, javelin and throwing in the sandpit, space hopper races and the

caterpillar in the play space outside our gate and running races (sprints & egg and spoon) in the main playground area. The sun shone, children were sporting throughout, and we all had fun.







In Nursery we continued our **Under the Sea** theme. We read **'Commotion in the Ocean'** and learned some poems by heart **octopus** and **jellyfish**. We learnt about jellyfish, and enjoyed singing the **Jellyfish Lullabubble'** song.

In mathematics we have been counting objects and recognising numerals up to 9. Our phonic learning has been the letter 'Yy' for yak.

Reception classes have begun to think about the transition they will be making to Key Stage 1 in September. They have been thinking about what they have achieved during the time they have been in Early Years and looking forward to the challenges ahead. Their mathematical learning has been focused on maps and journeys.



When the weather is now very warm and sunny you may want to think about applying sunscreen to your child **before** they come to school in the morning, and sending them in with a hat or cap (please add a name label as they are easily mislaid). We advise against children wearing open-toed sandals due to the risk of injury to their toes.

## Clothing, water bottles & lost property

Children need changing bags in school. They can leave them in school, and we will only send them home if they have had to change during the day. Any wet or dirty clothes will be put in a recycled plastic bag in the changing bag. *We always need more carrier bags, if you have them.* Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name, into school every day. *This should only contain fresh water.* 

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
