Learning Together for a Better Future







In Nursery we are learning about art and artists. We are looking at the art of Eric Carle as we enjoy the books that he has written and illustrated. We have learned about colours and how to mix the primary colours to paint a rainbow and we collaged our own star in the style of Eric Carle.

Our phonic learning has been the letter 'v' for violet.

In Reception the children have been celebrating Summer. They have used different media to make ice lollies and ice cream. Their mathematical learning has been focused on sharing. On Friday they held a Teddy Bears' Picnic in the garden.

Also this week we welcomed Imraen who has joined the team to replace Miranda who is on maternity leave. He is a specialist early years teacher who will be supporting Nursery on Tuesday and Thursday morning, Moon class on Wednesday and Star Class on Thursday afternoon.



As the weather is now very warm and sunny you may want to think about applying sunscreen to your child **before** they come to school in the morning, and sending them in with a hat or cap (please add a name label as they are easily mislaid). We advise against children wearing open-toed sandals due to the risk of injury to their toes.

Clothing, water bottles & lost property

Children need changing bags in school. They can leave them in school, and we will only send them home if they have had to change during the day. Any wet or dirty clothes will be put in a recycled plastic bag in the changing bag. *We always need more carrier bags, if you have them.* Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name, into school every day. *This should only contain fresh water.*

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
