This week in the EYFS

It was hot and we had lots of fun with water in the garden!









Nursery have continued learning about art and artists. On Tuesday we visited Chisenhale Art Gallery to look at the work of the sculptor Yu Ji. We made our own paper sculptures and have been learning about other artists who work in 3D. We have linked our work on art and artists to understanding the difference between 2D and 3D through shapes. In Mathematics we have been exploring and playing with die (which are cubes!).













Our phonic learning has been the letter 'w' for watch.







In Reception the children have read Tadpole's Promise. They have written their own stories. They have also been learning about frogs and their life-cycle. Their mathematical learning has been focused on odd and even numbers.

Summer!

As the weather is now very warm and sunny you may want to think about applying sunscreen to your child **before** they come to school in the morning, and sending them in with a hat or cap (please add a name label as they are easily mislaid). We advise against children wearing open-toed sandals due to the risk of injury to their toes.

Clothing, water bottles & lost property

Children need changing bags in school. They can leave them in school, and we will only send them home if they have had to change during the day. Any wet or dirty clothes will be put in a recycled plastic bag in the changing bag.

We always need more carrier bags, if you have them.

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name, into school every day.

This should only contain fresh water.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your

child's name and class!

It will help us to help your child to learn to look after their property.
