#### This Week in the EYFS

This week is Poetry Week at Chisenhale Primary School and our theme across the school has been 'London'. In Nursery our word of the week has been bridge as we have been learning the rhyme 'London Bridge is Falling Down'. We made bridges in the garden and discussed the materials and structures that are used to build bridges. We learned about the history of London Bridge and looked at all the different versions that have been built.. In the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme we have been learning how to read and write the letter Ww. In the Think Equal programme we have been thinking about sharing – and how difficult that can be!







Reception classes have been also been sharing poetry about London. They have written their own London poems which they performed to Nursery. They are continuing with phase 4 of the Tower Hamlets Phonics Programme and have been writing sentences that include words with adjacent consonants. They have been introduced to the final five tricky words: school, your, house, love and ago. They have been making maps and counting on from 10 in mathematics. On Tuesday the Reception classes visited Chisenhale Gallery to view the current exhibition by Dan Guthrie. After a guided tour of the exhibition they participated in a poetry workshop, and wrote their own response, which will be published. On Thursday, Reception enjoyed the third of five 'Artburst' workshops. The theme for this work is

'Our day out in Tower Hamlets'.

#### Health Issues in the EYFS

Please continue to be vigilant as we still have children with **chickenpox**Please see the NHS website for symptoms.

Chickenpox is infectious from 1 to 2 days before the rash starts. It stops being infectious when all the blisters have crusted over (5 - 6 days after the start). If your child has chickenpox, it is important that they stay away from school until there is no further risk of infecting another child or adult.

Also NHS guidelines state that if your child has **vomited** or had **diarrhoea** they must be symptom-free for 48 hours before returning to school to prevent infecting others.

These control measures are particularly important as we have children in the unit who have compromised immune systems and infections and viruses could significantly impact their health.



# Clothing, Water Bottles & Lost Property



Please ensure spare clothes are replenished and returned in changing bags.

As the weather turns warmer please consider providing a **sun hat** (named, please) and applying **sunscreen** to your child to protect them from the sun.

Children also need to continue to bring a water bottle into school every day.

All personal property should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class!
