Science

We have had a great half term in Science; Physics has been the focus of our Year 7 and 8 pupils where we have been investigating Forces and Electricity and Magnetism. Pupils in Year 8 have seen how static forces can bend a stream of water and make your hair stand on end, whilst our Year 7 classes have been learning how to use their mathematics skills to solve problems.



Year 6 have been learning about the classification of Species, we have looked in great detail at some unusual species and compared the differences between the 5 kingdoms. We had a great time investigating mould growth on bread, there were some disgusting results but the children were fascinated!

Year 5 have completed their learning on Chemistry and how different materials can be used for different jobs. They had great fun investigating how sugar dissolves; they really showed their skills in the lab!

French

Pupils have enjoyed a busy term in the French department. KS2 have had fun designing 3D towns, making and designing origami houses and creating alien puppet families to introduce family members! Whilst KS3 have performed interviews, written scripts, made props and performed plays...all in French!
