ACHIEVEMENT POINTS



Pupils are awarded achievement points in school.

These range from great attitude towards learning, representing the school, being kind, excellent work, excellent effort etc.

'Star of the Week' is awarded every week to the winner in each form and there is an overall winning form as well.



Their prize is a badge, an early dinner pass and some biscuits in the dining centre.

If your child is 'Star of the Week' you will be emailed a certificate and their forename will be shared on Social Media!

And, of course, you can keep up-to-date with all of your child's achievement points on the MCAS app!

BEHAVIOUR POINTS



Pupils are also awarded behaviour points in school.

These range from not having the correct equipment, not being ready to learn, not completing home learning etc. This helps us to ensure everyone is following the 4Rs.

We ask that parents/carers do not contact staff regarding minor issues, ie no equipment, distracted in class etc.

As always, if there is anything more serious we will contact you to discuss.

Any behaviour points that your child is given are shown on the MCAS app.

ATTENDANCE

If your child is absent, you must contact school EVERY day via the School Office before 9:30am.

Please provide evidence of all medical appointments.

Holidays: According to the Government, holidays should not be taken in term time unless in exceptional circumstances – you must contact us about this.

LOCKERS





Every pupil is issued with a locker.

If pupils leave their key at home, we have a master key in school but we will not ring you to bring your child's key in.

If your child loses their key – there is a charge of £5 for a replacement key.

UNIFORM



CONTACI



If you need to contact us, the first person that you should contact is your child's Form Tutor.

You should have received a welcome email from them in the first week including their email address.

Please remember that staff are all teaching and therefore you will not get an immediate response to your email. We will always try to reply within three days.

Safeguarding – If you have an urgent safeguarding concern, do please ring and ask to speak to Mrs Dawson (DSL) or myself (DDSL) and we will hopefully speak to you there and then.

THE SCHOOL OFFICE



The school office staff are wonderful, however sometimes the demands which are put upon them are unrealistic.

If you ring at 3.20pm to say that someone different is collecting your child and we need to let them know – it is highly unlikely that this will happen.

We will not ring home if your child has forgotten their PE kit or their locker key — we recommend that they leave their PE Kit in their locker for the week and take it home at the weekend. If they do forget their locker key we have master keys.

The office staff are unable to tell you when a member of staff will contact you back – please trust that they will and if you haven't heard after 3 days please send an email to the Head of Year or Head of Department and they will chase for you.

MOBILE PHONES







DO Turn off your phone before entering the school site (don't just put it on silent!)

DO Store your phone/device safely in your bag in your locker

OO Hand your phone to the office if you don't have your locker key

DO Leave your smart watch and your wireless headphones at home

DO NOT Use your phone at any time during the school day

DO NOT Take your phone out of your locker at any point

DO NOT Carry your phone around with you even if it is turned off

DO NOT Turn your phone back on until you have left the school site

CONSEQUENCES

1st Offence: Your phone/device will be confiscated and handed in to the office for collection at the end of the school day – a behaviour point will be added to SIMS.

2nd Offence: Your phone/device will be confiscated and handed in to the office for collection by a PARENT/CARER at the end of the school day . 4.30pm deadline (4.00pm on Friday). A behaviour point and a detention will be added to SIMS.

If your phone continues to be an issue in school – you may have to give it in every day or be banned from bringing it to school.

There are very few exceptions to these rules:

Home Learning Club: Pupils may take their phone (in their bag) to home learning club however they are still not permitted to use it on the school site.

Cancellation of Club or Fixtures: Pupils may use their phones (under the supervision of a member of school staff) to inform parents if directed to by the school office.
