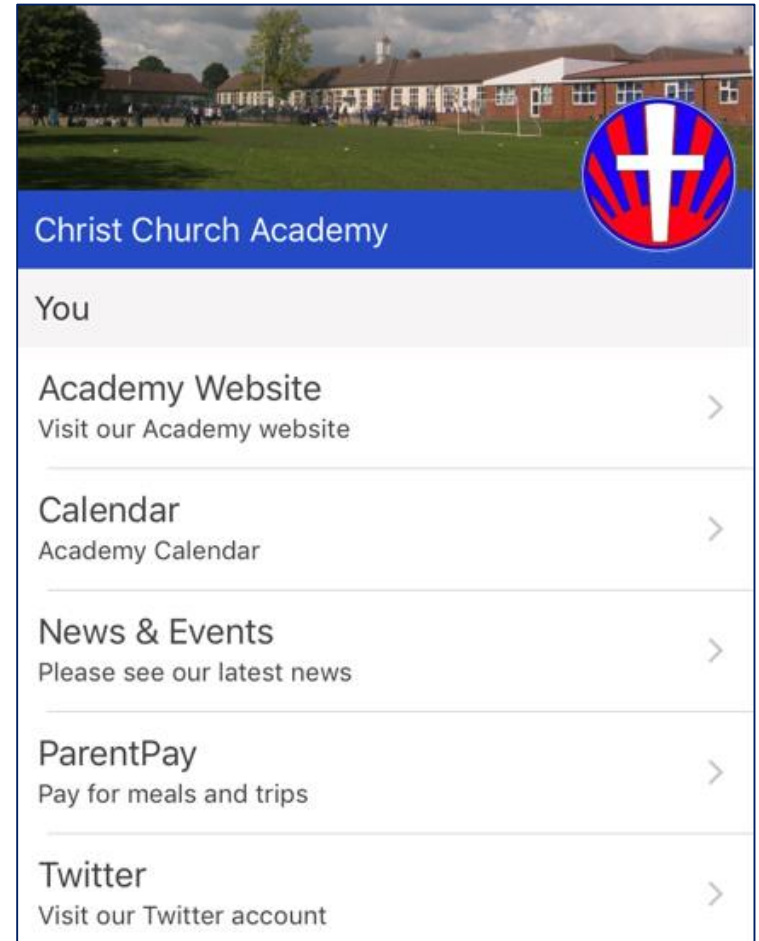


# OUR SCHOOL APP

# ATTENDANCE



If your child is poorly and won't be attending school, we need DAILY contact from you.

If a child's attendance drops below 90% we will contact you to discuss.

If your child needs a medical appointment, please make these outside of school hours. Where this is not possible (eg hospital appointments) the school office will ask for evidence of the appointment in order to authorise the absence.

# SCHOOL UNIFORM

## MAKE UP / HAIR

Please refer to the Uniform Policy 2023-24 which was emailed to parents/carers this week, and is also available on the school website.





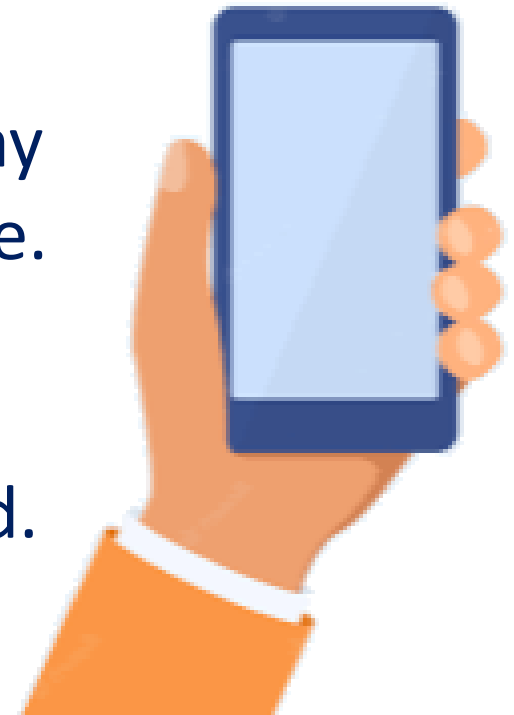
# MOBILE PHONES

# SCHOOL EQUIPMENT

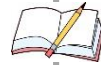
