This Newsletter showcases some of the exciting opportunities our young people have enjoyed so far this term.






Some of our **Year 7 Sports Leaders** went to Clip and Climb on Friday to support and help run the Year 3&4 climbing challenge.


X CUP FINAL WINNERS!!! **Y X**

The children also completed a topic on Lunar New Year and enjoyed dressing up, creating wonderful crafts and sampling Chinese food.






Our Mini Explorers toddler group has grown in popularity and they have enjoyed reading book such as

EYFS

Class 1 have been learning about Lunar New Year. To celebrate they made their own paper lanterns to decorate the classroom. They have also been enjoying the Chinese restaurant role play.

Life Cycles
