
SPOTLIGHT ON CREATIVE ARTS

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Why Good Attendance Matters

Regular attendance at school is one of the most important factors in a young person's success. Every lesson builds on the one before it, and even a small amount of absence can have a significant impact on learning, confidence, and progress.

When students attend school consistently, they:

- Keep up with new material and avoid gaps in their knowledge.
- Build positive relationships with teachers and classmates.
- Develop good routines, responsibility, and resilience.
- Feel more confident in their learning and assessments.

Research consistently shows a clear link between attendance and academic achievement. Students with higher attendance are far more likely to make expected progress and achieve strong results at GCSE. Missing just one day every two weeks adds up to nearly a month of lost learning across the school year.
