Exciting Curriculum Updates for 2024

In September 2024, we implemented exciting curriculum changes to provide a well-rounded education aligned with National Curriculum standards while addressing the holistic needs of our school community.

Highlights include making Art a standalone subject, adding Textiles to the technology rotation, embedding fortnightly PSHE lessons for all year groups, and offering a full Spanish curriculum to enhance language and cultural literacy.

Our transition to a five-period school day, with one lesson after lunch, has improved engagement, behaviour, and wellbeing for both students and staff. Thank you for your continued support as we strive to enrich our curriculum and learning environment.









Eco Week

CtK's first Eco event, 'Green Week', held on worldwide recycling week was a huge success with lots of pupils involved in various events throughout the week, all organised by our Eco Club.

The New CtK Student Council has Assembled!

This year's Student Council launch was nothing short of extraordinary, with a record-breaking 57% of students casting their votes - a big leap from last year's 41% turnout. A total of 242 votes were cast, showing just how passionate CtK students are about shaping their school's future.



The launch tied in perfectly with **UK Parliament Week** (18th–24th November), a nationwide celebration of democracy and active citizenship. Assemblies led by Mr Day and Miss Nayee fired up students, inspiring them to embrace leadership, governance and collaboration - values that lie at the heart of the Student Council's mission and *THE CTK WAY*. An impressive 85 students from Assisi, Goretti, Kolbe and Romero Houses stepped up to represent their peers. After an exciting week of campaigning, voting day on Friday, 22nd November, saw enthusiastic participation, and by the 28th November, the newly elected council held their first meeting.

Wasting no time, the Council immediately got to work on their first major project: a **Polar Express-themed Christmas Disco** to raise funds for St
