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


Odd Socks Day

Your child will be eligible for Free School Meals if you get any of these benefits:

• Income Support

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- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment & Support Allowance
- Support under V1 of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of state pension credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,900
- Working Tax Credit "run on" the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credits
